Dear Senators Schumer and Gillibrand and Congressman Zeldin:

I am writing on behalf of the East End Supervisors and Mayors Association to urge you to protect Plum Island, in the Town of Southold, New York, from sale by the General Services Administration and Department of Homeland Security. As you know, the Plum Island Animai Disease Center is scheduled to move its operations to the new National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility in Manhattan, Kansas, when the new facility is ready, sometime between 2020 and 2022. We believe that when the PIADC activities cease, the existing laboratory and supporting infrastructure contained on 20% of Plum Island's land area would be well suited for another type of research serving the public interest and that the remainder of the Island, zoned by the Town of Southold as a Conservation District, would be ideally suited as a wildlife refuge, preferably under the auspices of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.

We know there is tremendous public support for protecting the remarkable natural resources hosted by Plum Island as well as for retaining jobs there. We wish to see future proposals for the island's use comport with the Town of Southold's 2013 Plum Island zoning districts, which were prudently prepared for the long-term protection and support of all the best that Plum Island has to offer — high-value wildlife habitat and ecosystem services, coupled with a campus that would be perfect for attracting good jobs.

When we consider Plum Island's rich history and cultural significance as well as the many important habitats and species there, we must agree with the words of Ruth Ann Bramson, one of the authors of A World Unto Itself—the Remarkable History of Plum Island, New York, who said last summer that "the story of Plum Island is America's story in miniature," and that "[t]his island is owned by Americans, and it should stay that way."

We strenuously urge that the Federal Government move this year to protect Plum Island's rich resources and hold them in the public domain, supporting new uses for the research facilities and preserving 80% of the Island as a National Wildlife Refuge or its equivalent.
